Following the pledge of allegiance to the flag, County Administrator Michael Zurlo conducted roll call. All Legislators were present.

Legislator Dyer motioned to accept the minutes of the October 26th Regular Session, seconded by Legislator Hall. Carried (10-0-0).

Chairperson McManus read a proclamation to proclaim and promote Saturday, November 26th as "Small Business Saturday." A copy of the proclamation is attached and made part of the minutes.

Chairperson McManus asked if anyone present wished to address the Legislature.

Rodney Brown, the Deputy County Administrator, introduced Gerald Delaney, Chairman of the Adirondack Park Local Government Review Board. Mr. Delaney addressed the Legislature regarding the last resolution on the agenda, Resolution #834, titled, "Supporting a Reasonable Approach to Allow Access to State-Owned Lands in the Adirondack Park." This resolution supports and endorses a Memorandum of Understanding which was drafted by local communities and organizations in the Adirondacks in regards to a large, 20-acre parcel which was recently acquired by the State to ensure that proper public access is provided to this area. Mr. Delaney provided further information on this matter, and he thanked the Legislature for its support.

There being no one else who wished to address the Legislature, the Chairperson moved onto Committee Reports.

Chairperson McManus congratulated Simon Conroy for being elected as Area 4 County Legislator. He also thanked Legislator Sara Rowden for filling in during this vacancy.
