## DATE AND TIME OF ACCIDENT 02/22/2015 3:39pm

**NARRATIVE**: On the above date and time, Sheriff's Deputies responded to the intersection of State Route 11 and Cashman Road in the Town of Ellenburg for a motor vehicle accident reported by Agents with the US Border Patrol. Investigation at the scene revealed that Richard L. Decosse was attempting to cross over State Route 11 on his 1998 Polaris Snowmobile, when he failed to yield the right of way to a 2014 Nissan Sentra operated by Stamatia Pasarianos traveling east on Route 11. Psarianos took evasive action to avoid a collision with Decosse and left the roadway, striking a snow embankment and a street sign.

**DISPOSITION:** Both vehicles were towed from the scene. Ms. Psarianos was transported to CVPH Medical Center with arm pain. She was later released and charged with 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree Aggravated Unlicensed Operation, after a records check revealed her license to be suspended. Richard Decosse was found to be operating his snowmobile while in an intoxicated condition, with a blood alcohol content greater than .08%. He was processed at the Sheriff's Office and released on appearance tickets to appear in Town of Ellenburg Court in March. US Border Patrol, New York State Police and Ellenburg Fire Department assisted at the scene.
